President - Chairman: Michael Devlin

Apologies: George Flockhart, Bob Gibson, Johan Thayne, Malcolm Gisbey, Steve Nutley, Frank Anderson & Jack McHugh who had undergone treatment on both eyes for glaucoma, while fellow club mate and Group member, Gordon Smith is suffering from acute pulmonary problems.

Michael then spoke briefly of the Group's two members that had suffered severe injuries; these being David Pritchard, Kennoway C.C. who had been struck with a car whilst competing in Cumbria, and still receiving therapy; the other being David Millar, SVTTA, who, after a protracted recovery from his injuries, is now managing to get some cautious miles in.

Bereavements: A minutes silence was observed in respect of the late Shirley Gisbey, Glasgow Wheelers and National Honorary Life Member.

Minutes of 2017 AGM: Taken as read. Moved: George Skinner Seconded: James Skinner

Business arising from Minutes: There being no matters arising, the Chairman continued with the meeting.

Secretary: George McLaughlan.

Membership: George intimated that, although there were 36 new members to the Group, there was unfortunately, 38 removed from the register between resignations, health and membership renewal default. He then provided the following breakdown of the membership.

Total Members standing at 222: This consists of: --

Solo members - 137, an increase of 1

Solo Life members: 16, an increase of 1

Joint Life members: 4 (8), no change

Couples: 9 (18): 2 new couples, a decrease of 5 couples

National Hon Life Members: 43. This was an increase of 5.

Correspondence:

- a. A letter of thanks was received from Jock (John) Elder's daughter Anne thanking the Group for the visitation and presentation by Chairman Michael Devlin and committee member, Iain McLeod in recognition of Jock's 100th birthday.
- b. Email from Peter Ettles intimating that the Boomerang event was cancelled due to the lack of entries – only 6 teams had entered. As Peter mentioned, there would be more marshals out on the course than competitors.
- c. Emails from Mhairi Laffoley; Bob Gibson; Robert Clements and Bruce Fullerton thanking the Group for the donations to their events.
- d. Email 27th Nov from NEC committee regarding the current Standards review. This was a several page document outlining the anticipated outcome of the methodology used to reach a final conclusion of the review. The aspects embraced in this is the use of the CTT event information – measurement of Age decline – Records – Data availability – nature of courses, all of which is to try and achieve fairness across all ages and the potential to reset the Standards base time i.e. 1:06:00 for a 40 year old to a lower base time still to be determined.
This also reflected on the possibility of a separate system for Women.
- e. Email 5th Oct from NEC: This was an update on the new National membership website with the aim of setting three reminder renewal dates with the latter being mid February, after which, members not having renewed by this date will automatically be deleted: members wishing to renew after this date can do so in the normal manner i.e. Online – renew direct / Standing order etc, or via their Group's official.
- f. 19th Oct NEC: This was notice of "The Veteran" magazine now having had its index "Index Linked" so that it is possible to click on any page number on this page and it will automatically take the person to that page.
- g. Email - Group's website, Steve Nutley: Steve had informed the secretary that all race reports were now up to date, but in light of the NEC's aspirations in relation to the National website becoming an all-singing-all dancing set-up, queried if it would be viable to retain our own in light of this.
Having also informed the secretary of his willingness to continue in his post, it was agreed unanimously that the Group's site be retained.
- h. An email from the National Chairman, Andrew Simpkins, enquired if the Group would organise a National event for 2019, offering a choice of a 10, 30 or 50TT.

Honorary Time Trial Secretary: Jim Harris.

Having seen another influx of new members, Jim noted that most of them participated in time trials during the season. In all, he reported that during the season 120 members returned times to the Finish timekeeper.

Continuing his report, he was pleased to inform the members' present that Alasdair Washington, Caithness C.C., was this year's Group's Best All Rounder Champion, and noted that his results, which are included in the following list, are an inspiration to all senior members, as was our other stalwart, 85 year old Alex Munro.

Relating to the B.A.R., Jim, in light of the number of lady members within the Group and the prospect of this number increasing, expressed the possibility of introducing a Women's B.A.R. Championship.

Referring to Brian Muir and Jim Cusick, he noted that, although both having had a quiet season; Brian with nine events and Jim with a similar number, Brian had returned an excellent time in the 100TT, which secured him the Reilly Trophy, while Jim Cusick, although having competed in only one 50TT, will have his name on four of the Group's trophies.

The other member of note that had a relatively quiet season - Jim thought that this may have attributed to the lack of suitable events, was Carlos Riise who however, displayed his prowess on winning the Group's 15TT championship event.

Having commented on the Ladies, he then spoke of Christine Mackenzie's sterling performances in that, she increased her 24 hour event distance by 35 miles from the 2017 Mersyside event. And while this earned her 2nd in the R.T.T.C., Ladies Championship section, it also gained her 1st on Standard in the National Veteran Championship, which is incorporated in the same event.

On the home front, her time in the Eddy Taylor Ladies Short Distance competition was good enough to see her finish in second position.

Jim noted that, although Sean Quinn was unable to compete in a 100TT in Scotland, he managed to finish two such events on English courses and returned the commendable times of 4.01.33, and 4.06.58. And in the 12 hour event returned a distance of 265.838 miles – in the absence of a Scottish 12 hour event English events count – earned Sean the John Cusker Memorial Trophy; but had to retire during the Group's 30TT due to injury.

He then recognised Bob Brown who has been “knocking on the door” for a number of years, finally earning himself the 30TT Pinky Williams Trophy, which placed Carlos Riise second on Standard by one second. And on the new membership front, he was pleased to note that Neil Pendrich had returned fantastic times in the 10 and 25 Time Trials, and now looked forward to Neil's performances next season.

Before finishing his report, he recognised that the new generation of Scottish vets are returning fantastic rides as time goes by and then gave a brief outline of the nature of the V.TT.A., in that, it was formed to keep 40 year old cyclists and above active within the club scene, as well as the competitive one. To facilitate this, and also allow members to compete against themselves regardless of others performances, the Standard Tables were created which allows members to set their own goals.

On concluding he wished all members the Best for 2019, and suggested that, where a club has members of qualifying age, they should be encouraged to join the S.V.T.T.A.

Honorary Road Race Secretary:

The secretary was pleased to announce that the winner of the Jacky Connor Trophy – for the first Group vet to finish the nominated event - was new member David Ross of the Falkirk B.C. The event was the Tom Anderson Memorial Road Race organised by Falkirk B.C. However, the Jim Lyon Trophy – age 60 and over Group member – being organised by the Ivy C.C., fell foul of road works on the course, and therefore cancelled.

Honorary Treasurer: Steve Beech.

Referring to the Group's overall income and expenses, Steve noted that the overall loss this year had been reduced to a loss of £46.00, which was a vast improvement from the 2017 audit. Before proceeding with the audit figures, he explained the reason for two entries of expenses not normally associated with the Group business.

However, he informed the members that the Group was recipient of a donation of £439.00, from West Lothian Council through the auspices of committee member Frank Anderson.

The following is the audit report: --

Net income: £2,339 Expenses: £2,385

Expenses: SVTTA/VTTA medals – engraving £1223.00. Race subsidies £525.00. VTТА donation / expense £380.00. SC / CTT affiliation fees £105.00. National AGM expense £100.00 and website host £52.29.

Bank Balance £5,200. Assets - Group clothing £1,700.

On finishing his report Jim Harris enquired as to the benefit derived from the VTТА donation. This was responded to by the secretary in that a request for a donation to off-set the National web / Membership Online system expenses had been made to all 16 Groups, and that part of this expense was attributed to the National Chairman's expenses when attending a meeting arranged to instruct several committee members on the use of the Online system, which would allow new members / members renew on line rather than surface mail the secretary. Also, the system was being programmed to deduct membership levies at source, which will save Group Treasurers a lot of hassle.

Gordon provided a report of the members competing at the Masters Track Championship Newport Wales. On the 28th June - 2nd July as follows: --

Female 50 – 54 E group 500m TT, Patricia Baird finished 5th with a time of 41.857, and Janette Hazlet 7th with a time of 44.450.

In the 200m TT Sprint, Patricia finished 2nd with a 13.908, and Janette 3rd with a time of 14.838

In the pursuit event Patricia finished 5th with a 2.41.228

In the Scratch event – 8 k, Gillian Anderson finished 12th, Janette 13th Patricia 13th and Elizabeth Clayton 14th:

Race time was 11m 47sec.

Both Gillian and Patricia also featured in the Points Race event.

Also competing at Newport was Tom Clark, who, at age 73 took part in the 500m TT event to finish in a time of 46:374 and finished in 4th position. Gordon himself finished 5th in the 500m TT with a 49.:243, and finished 4th in the 2000m Pursuit with a time of 3:12.776: these being two new records.

Proposals

Item 1: The Tom McGinness Meritorious Award: Alasdair Washington, Caithness C.C.

Jim Harris spoke on behalf of 81 year old Alasdair's performances throughout the season and was pleased that he had been recognised in this manner, having won the B.A.R, Archie Speed 3 distance Trophy and the John Cramb Handicap Trophy. Proposal carried unanimously.

Item 2: As it was passed at the National AGM 2017, to increase the individual membership levy across the board by £3.00, and after considerable discussion, it was agreed that the Group reflect this increase in their own levy structure as follows, which means that Solo membership is now £20.00, Couples £25.00 and for life members wishing to purchase “The Veteran” magazine, £9.00: National Hon members exempt.

The secretary informed the members that at the same meeting it was also agreed to dispense with acceptance of new Life Memberships.

Proposal carried.

Item 3: Proposal by the NEC to set a Standards fee of £15.00 across the board: A short discussion took place after which, it was agreed unanimously that the Group apply its current fee of £10.00, and instructed the delegates to vote against this proposal at the National AGM in January.

Group proposal carried unanimous.

A.O.C.B:

1. Track Secretary, Gordon, having spoken earlier on Track matters, and having had successful negotiations with national track officials over the recognition for the aged 80, and over competitor, proposed that the Group recognise the new different track distances, which are – Flying 200 & 500m TT’s, and the 1500m Pursuit event. In essence, only individual efforts are recognised. Agreement was unanimous.
Adding to Gordon’s address, Tom Clark spoke of the £280.00 costs associated with establishing a record.
2. George Skinner put forward the suggestion that the start and finish of the 30TT be moved, and that Willie Cosh – CTT, was prepared to measure the course.
After a brief discussion, Dave Bean pointed out that any change to the current course would prove difficult to time-keep. This considered, and with no definitive start / finish areas, this was not accepted.
- a. George then approached the subject of establishing courses in the Dumfries / Lockerbie areas. Gordon Johnston responded to this, intimating that there is an established 10 & 25TT course, and the prospect of a 30 course is being checked out, as a new roundabout that has been constructed allows the use of another 5 miles on a particular stretch of road. The potential for a 100TT route, with the possible use of part of the old A74 being used, is also being viewed.
3. Iain McLeod referring to the SC / CTT connection pointed out that members can’t change results on these sites, and that organisers should complete Standards before submitting their results to the site. Also, the V.T.T.A. will not include SC results on the CTT site.
4. Gordon, having submitted two Standard claims which were refused by the Race Secretary sought clarification as to reasons for this.
